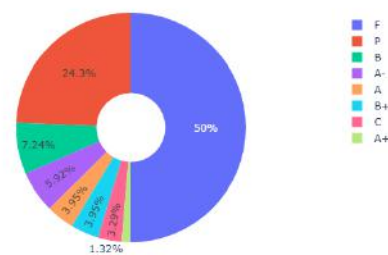

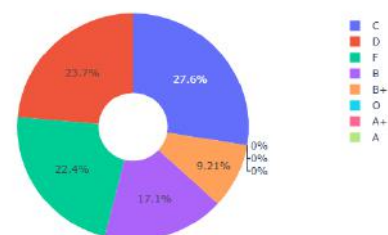

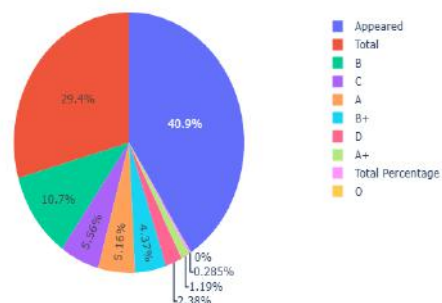
F.Y.B.Com Grade Distribution

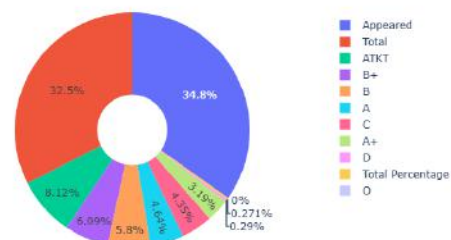


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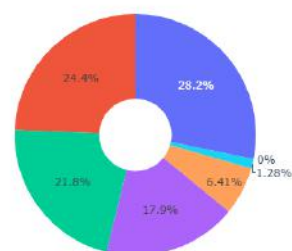

SYBMS Grade Distribution



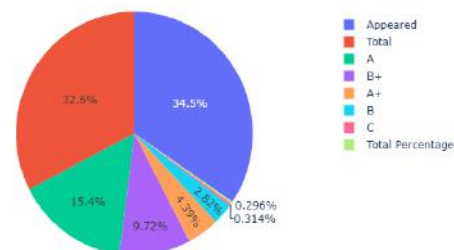

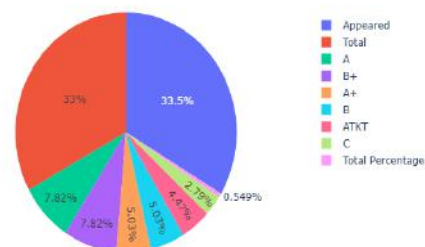


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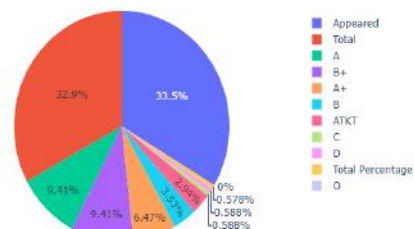

S.Y.B.A.F Grade Distribution



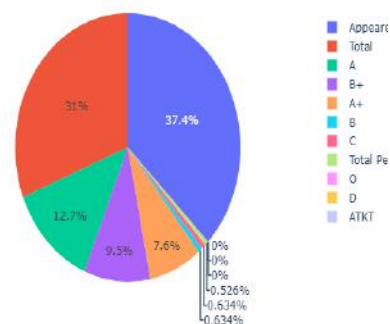

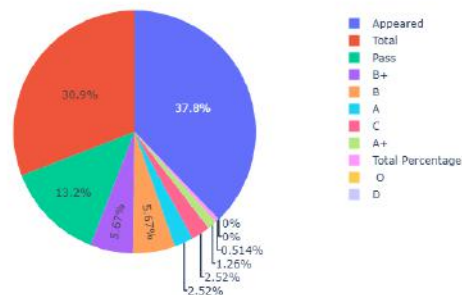


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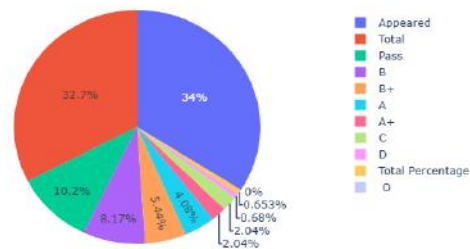

Grade Distribution - S.Y.B.B.I



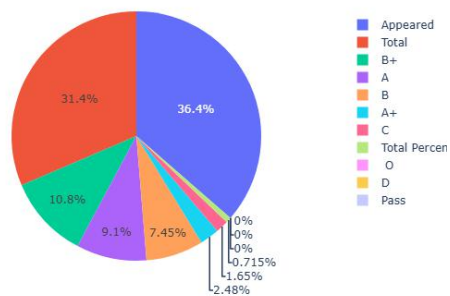

Grade Distribution - T.Y.B.B.I



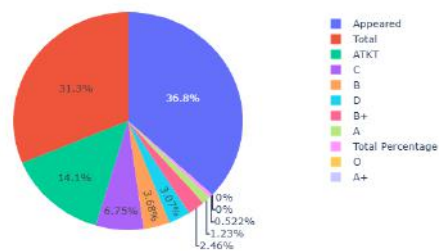


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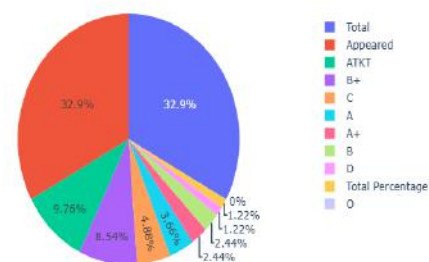

Grade Distribution for S.Y.BFM



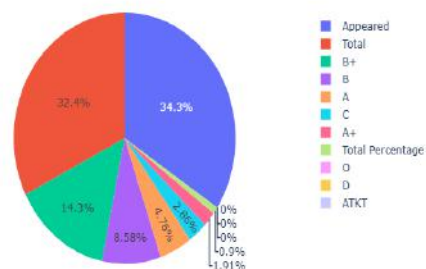

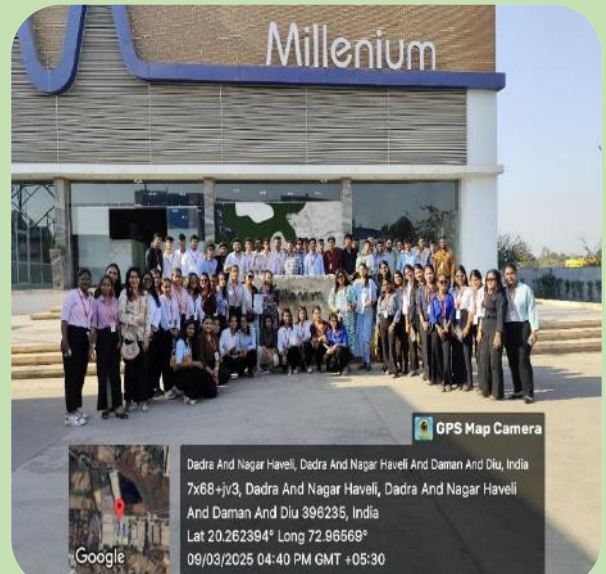

“ आर्टिफिशियल इंटेलिजेंस का भविष्य: अवसर और चुनौतियाँ ”

परिचय आर्टिफिशियल इंटेलिजेंस (AI) 21वीं सदी की सबसे क्रांतिकारी तकनीकों में से एक बन गया है। स्वास्थ्य, वित्त, शिक्षा और मनोरंजन जैसे क्षेत्रों में AI बदलाव ला रहा है और हमारे जीवन व कार्य करने के तरीकों को नया रूप दे रहा है। हालांकि, AI कई अवसर प्रदान करता है, लेकिन इसके साथ कई चुनौतियाँ भी जुड़ी हुई हैं।

AI के अवसर

1. स्वचालन और दक्षता :- AI-संचालित सिस्टम कार्यों को तेज़ी और सटीकता से कर सकते हैं। विनिर्माण (मैन्युफैक्चरिंग) उद्योग में, AI-रोबोट उत्पादन क्षमता बढ़ाते हैं, जिससे लागत घटती है और उत्पादकता में वृद्धि होती है।
2. स्वास्थ्य क्षेत्र में प्रगति :- AI स्वास्थ्य सेवा में क्रांतिकारी बदलाव ला रहा है। यह बीमारियों का शीघ्र पता लगाने, व्यक्तिगत उपचार प्रदान करने और नई दवाओं की खोज में मदद करता है। मशीन लर्निंग एल्गोरिदम कैंसर जैसी बीमारियों का प्रारंभिक चरण में पता लगाकर उपचार की सफलता की संभावना बढ़ा सकते हैं।

AI की चुनौतियाँ

1. नौकरियों का नुकसान :- AI स्वचालन (ऑटोमेशन) से कई पारंपरिक नौकरियाँ समाप्त हो सकती हैं। हालाँकि, नए रोजगार के अवसर भी पैदा होंगे, लेकिन कर्मचारियों को नए कौशल सीखने की आवश्यकता होगी।
2. नैतिक (एथिकल) चिंताएँ :- AI के साथ कई नैतिक मुद्दे जुड़े हैं, जैसे एल्गोरिदम में पूर्वाग्रह (बायस), गोपनीयता (प्राइवेसी) का उल्लंघन, और पारदर्शिता की कमी। यह सुनिश्चित करना आवश्यक है कि AI प्रणाली निष्पक्ष और भेदभाव रहित हो।

निष्कर्ष

आर्टिफिशियल इंटेलिजेंस दुनिया को सकारात्मक रूप से बदल सकता है, लेकिन इसकी चुनौतियों को नज़रअंदाज़ नहीं किया जा सकता। AI के फायदों को बढ़ाने और जोखिमों को कम करने के लिए हमें ज़िम्मेदार AI विकास, नैतिक विचारों और कार्यबल के अनुकूलन पर ध्यान देना होगा। यदि सही ढंग से प्रबंधित किया जाए, तो AI प्रगति का एक शक्तिशाली उपकरण बन सकता है और एक स्मार्ट व कुशल भविष्य का निर्माण कर सकता है।
